Fish, Fish, Fish... Look at this recent catch by Dan Barnes. Who said you couldn't catch a big one in Lake Troy Douglas? Our lake is still overstocked with fish—all species—so do your part and get out and fish! Keep or dispose of all you catch, except bass over 17" per the 2020 Catch and Release Guidelines. We hope to be able to conduct the second annual Fishing Tournament some time this summer.

Boat Stickers ... [NEW] Registering your watercraft is now easier. You may submit the registration form for your boat and other watercraft on-line through the McLendon Hills POA website (on the Lake and Wildlife page). You may also download a copy of the form.

Dogs... We have many new neighbors and more are expected as construction continues in McLendon Hills. Many residents are outdoors enjoying the warmer weather, nature, and walking their dogs. Even though a lot is not built on (yet), it is still private property. Be mindful of your neighbors and clean up after your dog after he does his business. Cleaning up after your animals <u>everywhere</u> is important, and it is the neighborly thing to do.





Other Animals... We live in an area where seeing wildlife is normal. Who doesn't enjoy seeing a fox squirrel, wild turkeys, red foxes and various waterfowl, or all the fuzzy goslings, baby rabbits and fawns as they grow? As in all other nearby neighborhoods, a snake is occasionally seen but there is no cause for alarm. Just be aware of your surroundings when you are outside and if you should happen to see one, just walk away.

If you are interested in wildlife common to this area, the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission (<u>www.ncwildlife.org</u>) is a good source of information.
